27,546 tonnes of rock phosphate in a a day on June 24 (Monday). They surpassed their previous single day handling record of
26,527 tonnes rock phosphate in the vessel MV Anemos on September 8, 2012.

On Monday, they handled 1,019 more tonnes in the vessel MV Ince Kastamonu. MV Ince Kastamonu from Port of Aqaba (Jordan) came to Tuticorin with a parcel of 55,450 tonnes and discharged 27,546 tonnes rock phosphate in a single day using harbour mobile cranes and hoppers

According to a press release from the port trust, M/s Seatrans Ship Management, Tuticorin, was the steamer agent and M/s Villavarayar and Sons, Tuticorin, was the stevedore. The consignee M/s Green Star Fertilizers Limited uses rock phosphate as raw material to manufacture fertilizers.
